Grass	Yes			Grasscycle-Leave clippings on the lawn as fertilizer. If bagging clippings, place in brown kraft paper bags, set out opposite trash containers. Can place in trash barrels. Leave covers off.
Leaves	Yes^^			Compost, or place in brown kraft paper bags, set out opposite trash containers. Can place in trash barrels. Leave covers off.
Other yard waste	Yes			Compost, or place in brown kraft paper bags, or in barrels with covers off.
