 - A. Minutes of previous meeting were disseminated and reviewed by all TTSC members prior to this meeting.

 - A. A letter was sent to State DOT approving the removal of trees and a guide wire on Limerock Road at Orchard Meadows Drive.
 - B. Mr. Paul Bannon will speak on the Citizens Bank Traffic Study. He was invited to speak specifically in regard to increased Smithfield traffic from Citizens Bank employees, and answer any questions from the Town Traffic Commission.
 - C. Follow up to the motorcycle and truck noise complaint on Smith Avenue.
 - D. Letters were sent to Senator Archambault, and Representatives Winfield and Costantino, asking for funding for the Old County Road flashing school sign. The physical alteration permit has been applied for through State DOT.

V. New Business

- A.** Mr. Edmond Assili, 645 Douglas Pike, requests additional lighting at the RIPTA bus stop located at 645 Douglas Pike. He feels the bus stop is dangerous because there is no lighting there. He recommends a flood light to illuminate the area to make it safe for employees and customers.
- B.** Ms. Ann Andrews requests widening of Douglas Pike at Whipple Road or posting signage prohibiting passing vehicles on the right, as they are turning south on to Whipple.
- C.** Mr. Chad Morrison of 16 MacIntosh Drive, requests a stop sign on Cortland Lane at MacIntosh Drive. He further recommends a stop line and a divider line as traffic has increased with the Cherry Blossom Lane development.
- D.** Ms. Sharon Roberto of 19 Whipple Avenue, requests a “Blind Driveway” sign before 19 Whipple Avenue as cars traveling down Whipple Road cannot see her driveway.
